#### **Overview**


- PRISM is a partnership between state organizations, the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research at the University of North Carolina (Sheps Center), and 3RNET.
- PRISM provides a standardized and state-of-the-art way for states to routinely gather real-time data from clinicians as they serve in states' and the National Health Service Corps' (NHSC) loan repayment, scholarship, J-1 Visa Waiver and other incentive programs.
- PRISM routinely collects data to identify and document outcomes to enhance the retention of clinicians.
- PRISM gathers, analyzes and presents retention data for clinicians (of all types) serving in incentive programs in a variety of settings.
- PRISM builds shared interest, cooperation and group wisdom in best practices to promote retention among collaborative states.




## Accomplishments

- Six new states joined the Collaborative
  > NH, OH, WV, MS, HI, KS
- Conrad 30 / J1 Visa Waiver survey
  - <u>Report on findings</u> for 2022 survey completed in early 2023
  - Modified surveys based on what we learned in 2022
  - Second year of survey completed in June 2023 (27 states participated)
- Celebrated 10 year anniversary
- Partnered with the Behavioral Health Workforce Research Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill
  - Study on preparing behavior health clinicians for success in rural safety net practices
  - Policy brief submitted to funders
  - Paper for publication submitted to the Journal of Rural Health

**2013 – Participating states** 




**2023** – Participating states
